RESOLUTION NO. 15

WHEREAS, physician burnout is found to be at an alarming rate of 62.8%¹, while satisfaction with
 work-life integration is dropping and average depression scores among physicians is rising;
 and

WHEREAS, suicide is a leading cause of resident physician death which demonstrates the necessity for
 supportive environments and early intervention at the level of graduate medical education as
 "integral to reducing preventable deaths and fostering a healthy physician workforce"²; and

WHEREAS, Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) 2023 program
requirements for GME in family medicine include "education of [...] identification of the
symptoms of burnout, depression, [...] suicidal ideation, [...] including means to assist those
who experience these conditions" as well as "providing access to confidential, affordable
mental health assessment, counseling, and treatment"³; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) stresses the
 importance of residency programs to provide a list of resources, publicly available to all
 residents at the start of each academic year, for confidential and accessible mental health
 assessments, counseling, and treatments to assist in reducing burnout of medical trainees.
