SUBJECT: Proposed amendments to the ACOFP Bylaws regarding Officer Composition and Terms

## RESOLUTION NO. 7

WHEREAS, the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) Board of Governors drafted and approved the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan in October 2019 and Congress was first able to approve it in March 2021; and

WHEREAS, one key objective raised by the Board during strategic planning in June 2019 was to work on enhancing ACOFP's organizational effectiveness by assessing and streamlining our governance structure; and

WHEREAS, the Board's goal is to ensure ACOFP is being governed in a way that is responsive to today's fast-changing society and profession, ensuring a more representative, effective and efficient board, which will naturally make ACOFP a more nimble and successful organization; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Governors self-assessments in 2020, 2021 and 2022 identified Board composition as the assessment factor rated with the greatest opportunity for improvement, backed up by qualitative feedback; and

WHEREAS, to support this goal and given the pandemic, strategic planning and Board feedback, the Board voted to appoint a Governance Task Force to explore leading practices in governance of healthcare organizations charged the Task Force to:
Align ACOFP's board composition and committee structures to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of governance in order to advance the profession and sustain the organization. The aspirational organizational objectives include:

- Being efficient, effective and inclusive
- Advancing organizational performance
- Ensuring all appointments are based on objective competencies and multi-faceted diversity elements that are needed to represent the membership and profession
- Creating processes that are perceived as open, fair and consistent
- Increasing leadership opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Governors sought counsel from the Association Management Center (AMC) dating back to February 2020 to review ACOFP's current governance, benchmark ACOFP against association leading practices, and provide governance training to the Board; and

WHEREAS, AMC conducted leadership interviews and sent out a survey in April 2020 to committee members, ACOFP Future Leaders alum and past presidents asking feedback to help evaluate factors that impact the effectiveness of the ACOFP's governance structure; and

WHEREAS, the April 2020 Governance and March 2021 Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) surveys illustrate member confusion on ACOFP's leadership pathways and opportunities as currently organized; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Governors focused their generative discussions at the June 2020 and 2021 strategic planning meetings around ways to further enhance ACOFP's governance; and

WHEREAS, volunteers are increasingly not willing or unable to commit 10+ years of service on the Board, but still have interest and valuable insights and perspective to share to advance the mission and vision of the ACOFP; and

WHEREAS, the Vice President, Immediate Past President and Second Past President roles, comprising half of the Executive Committee, all have the same scope of responsibility in the ACOFP Bylaws to "perform duties and provide advice and counsel as requested by the President" and this can continue to be achieved in the same manner by any and all members of the Executive Council; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of the Vice President and second Past President is fiscally responsible and would allow for one New-in-Practice (NIP) Governor to be elected to the Board for a single two (2) year term therefore ensuring that a younger career physician is on the Board to increase leadership opportunities and the ability to adapt more quickly to organizational needs and representation of the diversity of the membership; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Governors took into consideration feedback gained from the 2022 ACOFP Congress of Delegates and made three notable changes from the 2022 resolution pertaining to the Bylaws which includes adding a New-in-Practice Governor to ensure this perspective is represented; adding a $5^{\text {th }}$ rotating, voting member of the Executive Committee, selected from one of the six Governors-at-large by the ACOFP Board of Governors; and removing the recommendation to automatically ascend the Secretary/Treasurer to the President-Elect position; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) changes the Officer composition by eliminating the Vice President and Second Past President positions to allow for a New-in-Practice Governor to be elected for a single (2) year term; and, be it further

RESOLVED, the ACOFP Board of Governors total composition will consist of 13 total voting members including 4 officers, 6 Governors-at-large, 1 New-in-Practice Governor, 1 Resident Governor, 1 Student Governor and 2 non-voting members: Speaker and Vice Speaker; and, be it further

RESOLVED, the ACOFP Board of Governors will select a Governor-at-large, as detailed in the Board Operating Policy Manual, to serve as a $5^{\text {th }}$ voting member of the Executive Committee for a one-year term; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the ACOFP changes the following articles and sections of the Bylaws to be modified and read as follows:

## ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF GOVERNORS

## Section 2. Composition

A. The Board of Governors shall consist of the President, President-Elect, the Immediate Past President, and sfor the preding yars, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, six (6) Governors-at-large, one New-in-Practice Governor, who shall be a New-in-Practice member at the time of election, one Osteopathic Resident Governor, or an allopathic Resident Governor in osteopathic focused education at a family medicine residency with ACGME osteopathic recognition status and one Osteopathic Student Governor as provided for in these Bylaws.
B. The Speaker and Vice Speaker of the Congress of Delegates shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Governors with voice but no vote.

## Section 3. Quorum

A quorum of the Board of Governors shall will be a simple thajority of the total eligible voting Board members, which includes current $\ominus$ Officers and si* Governors.-atarge.

## ARTICLE VII - OFFICERS

## Section 1. Composition

The elected officers of the College shall be the President, President-Elect, the Immediate Past President from the preding yers, Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer.

Section 5. Duties of Officers

C - Vice President:
The Vice President shall perform the duties requested by the President,
E. Immediate Past President Past President:

The Immediate Past President and Past Presidentshall perform duties and provide advice and counsel as requested by the President.
F. Vacancies:
(1) In the event the office of President becomes vacant, the President-Elect assumes the oftie office of the President. The office of President-Elect shall then be declared vacant, and said position shall be assumed filled the Secretary/Treasurer. The President shall appoint an individual to assume the office of Secretary/Treasurer as provided in these Bylaws.
(2) In the event the President becomes disabled and unable to perform the duties of his-the office, but does not request the President-Elect to assume the duties of the President, it shall be the prerogative of the Board of Governors to declare the President disabled and request the President-Elect to assume the duties of the President. Such action can only be taken by a two-thirds vote of quorum of Board members present and voting.

## ARTICLE IX - ELECTIONS

Section 1. General
A. The President-Elect, Officers-Secretary/Treasurer, Governors-at-large, New-in-Practice Governor, two Governors representing the Academic Members of the College, Speaker and Vice Speaker shall be elected by the Congress of Delegates at the annual meeting.

## Section 2. Terms

A. The President-Elect, President-and Secretary/Treasurer shall each be elected for a one-year term or until their successors are elected.
B. The Speaker and Vice Speaker shall be elected to serve for a one-year term or until their successors are elected.
C. At least Ftwo of the six Governors-at-large shall be elected annually to a three-year term.
D. The New-in-Practice Governor shall be elected for a single two-year term.
E.円. The Resident and Student Governors shall be elected annually for a one-year term.

## Section 3. Term Limits

A. The President-Elect shall be elected to serve a maximum three-year term, sequentially, as President-Elect, President, and Immediate Past President,an Past President with no opportunity for re-election to any of these positions.
B. The Vice Presidentshall serve maximum of three (3) one-year terms.
C. The Secretary/Treasurer shall serve a maximum up to nine (9) consective-oneyear terms.
D. The Speaker and Vice Speaker of the Congress of Delegates shall each serve a maximum of up to nine (9) consecutive one-year terms.
E. Governors, other than those whose terms are defined above, shall be limited to two (2) consecutive three-year (3) terms as Governor, with the exception that the Governor may complete the term in which six (6) years or more of service is completed.

## ARTICLE X - DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Executive Committee
A. The composition of the Executive Committee will include the elected officers of the College: the President, President-Elect, the Immediate Past Presidents the preding the Vice President, and the-Secretary/Treasurer and one Governor at-large selected by the Board of Governors who shall serve a oneyear term.
