C-3/23SUBJECT: Access to abortion when needed to save a pregnant patient's life SUBMITTED BY: Colorado Chapter of the ACOFP 2023 American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) REFERRED TO: **Congress of Delegates RESOLUTION NO. 8** WHEREAS, abortion is illegal in many states prior to knowledge of life-threatening conditions including but not limited to severe pre-eclampsia, molar pregnancy, ectopic pregnancy, premature rupture of membranes, chromosomal abnormalities, Meckel Gruber syndrome, Potter's syndrome, anencephaly; and WHEREAS, many life-threatening conditions are diagnosed after the timeline whereby abortion is legal; and WHEREAS, pregnant patients may die or have adverse consequences without termination of the pregnancy; now, therefore be it RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) advocates for health policies, including those pertaining to reproductive and obstetrical care, that protect

the sanctity and privacy of the physician-patient relationship; and, be it further
