RESOLUTION NO. 11

- 1 WHEREAS, an American Medical Association 2017 Report states physician burnout across all
- 2 specialties is between 40 and 60%; ¹ and
- 3 WHEREAS, a 2018 Medscape National Physician Burnout Survey stated 56% of participants identified
- 4 excessive bureaucratic tasks (charting, paperwork), 39 % identified spending excessive hours at work
- 5 and 24% identified increased computerization of practice (Electronic Health Records) as 3 of the 4
- 6 highest reasons for burnout;² and
- 7 WHEREAS, EHRs have failed as a tool to improve health care outcomes in the United States and have
- 8 not been able to achieve any of the quadruple aims (1. improve health outcomes 2. lower costs 3.
- 9 improve patient experience 4. improve physician satisfaction); ^{3,4} and
- 10 WHEREAS, current EHRs disrupt the physician patient relationship by requiring physicians to spend
- time clicking boxes and to alter their natural workflow, taking time away from direct patient
- 12 interaction; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the evolution of EHRs has failed to advance as rapidly as other computer software; and
- 14 WHEREAS, physicians believe technology exists that can produce an electronic health record system
- which naturally integrates into the physician's workflow and does not intrude into the physician
- patient relationship or require redundant data entry; now, therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) will work with the
- 18 Physicians' Electronic Health Record Coalition (PEHRC) to assertively call upon the Electronic Health
- 19 Record industry to accelerate the development and implementation of an Electronic Health Record
- 20 product or modifications which will facilitate the quadruple aim of health care (1. Improved health
- outcomes 2. Lower health cost 3. Improved patient experience 4. Improved physician satisfaction); and
- be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, that these improved EHRs shall integrate into the natural workflow of the physician and
- 24 *decrease* the physician's administrative and documentation burden; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, that ACOFP will include the goals in the two above resolves as part of its Principles of
- 26 Health Care Reform.⁵
