Proposed amendments to the ACOFP Bylaws regarding Officer SUBJECT: **Composition and Terms** SUBMITTED BY: **ACOFP Board of Governors** REFERRED TO: 2022 American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) **Congress of Delegates RESOLUTION NO. 24** WHEREAS, the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) Board of Governors drafted and approved the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan in October 2019 and Congress was first able to approve it in March 2021; and WHEREAS, one key objective raised by the Board during strategic planning in June 2019 was to work on enhancing ACOFP's organizational effectiveness by assessing and streamlining our governance structure; and WHEREAS, the Board's goal is to ensure ACOFP is being governed in a way that is responsive to today's fast-changing society and profession, ensuring a more representative, effective and efficient board, which will naturally make ACOFP a more nimble and successful organization; and WHEREAS, the Board of Governors self-assessments in 2020 and 2021 identified Board composition as the assessment factor rated with the greatest opportunity for improvement, backed up by qualitative feedback; and WHEREAS, to support this goal and given the pandemic, strategic planning and Board feedback, the Board voted to appoint a Governance Task Force to explore leading practices in governance of healthcare organizations charged the Task Force to: Align ACOFP's board composition and committee structures to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of governance in order to advance the profession and sustain the organization. The aspirational organizational objectives include: • Being efficient, effective and inclusive • Advancing organizational performance • Ensuring all appointments are based on objective competencies and multi-faceted diversity elements that are needed to represent the membership and profession Creating processes that are perceived as open, fair and consistent Increasing leadership opportunities; and WHEREAS, the ACOFP Board of Governors sought council from the Association Management Center (AMC) dating back to February 2020 to review ACOFP's current governance, benchmark ACOFP against association leading practices, and provide governance training

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to the Board; and

35 36 37 38	WHEREAS, AMC conducted leadership interviews and sent out a survey in April 2020 to committee members, ACOFP Future Leaders alum and past presidents asking feedback to help evaluate factors that impact the effectiveness of the ACOFP's governance structure; and
39 40 41	WHEREAS, the April 2020 Governance and March 2021 Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) surveys illustrate member confusion on ACOFP's leadership pathways and opportunities as currently organized; and
42 43 44	WHEREAS, the Board of Governors focused their generative discussions at the June 2020 and 2021 strategic planning meetings around ways to further enhance ACOFP's governance; and
45 46 47 48	WHEREAS, volunteers are increasingly not willing or unable to commit 10+ years of service on the Board, but still have interest and valuable insights and perspective to share to advance the mission and vision of the ACOFP; and
49 50 51 52 53 54	WHEREAS, the Vice President, Immediate Past President and Second Past President roles, comprising half of the Executive Committee, all have the same scope of responsibility in the ACOFP Bylaws to "perform duties and provide advice and counsel as requested by the President" and this can continue to be achieved in the same manner by any and all members of the Executive Council; and
55 56 57 58 59 60	WHEREAS, the elimination of the Vice President and second Past President is fiscally responsible and would allow for more than one Governor-at-large to be appointed to the Board yearly therefore increasing leadership opportunities and the ability to adapt more quickly to organizational needs and representation of the diversity of the membership; now, therefore be it
61 62 63 64	RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) change the Officer composition by eliminating the Vice President and Second Past President positions to allow for additional Governors-at-large to be appointed yearly; and, be it further
65 66 67 68 69	RESOLVED, that there will be an ascension to the presidency starting with the election of the Secretary-Treasurer who will then automatically become President-elect, followed by President and then Past President, serving 1-year terms in each role unless otherwise removed by Congress; and, be it further
70 71 72	RESOLVED, that Congress will still elect the proposed Secretary-Treasurer, but not the President-Elect given the ascension of roles, and, be it further
73 74 75 76	RESOLVED, that Congress will retain the ability to nominate candidates for the Secretary- Treasurer role, Governors-at-large, Resident Governor, Student Governor, Speaker and Vice Speaker from the floor; and, be it further
77 78 79 80	RESOLVED, the ACOFP Board total composition will consist of 13 total voting members including 4 officers, 7 Governors-at-large, 1 Resident Governor, 1 Student Governor and 2 non-voting members: Speaker and Vice Speaker; and, be it further

81 RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) change the 82 following articles and sections of the Bylaws to be modified and read as follows: 83 84 (Old material crossed out, new material added in color) 85 ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF GOVERNORS 86 **Section 2.** Composition 87 88 A. The Board of Governors shall consist of the President, President-Elect, the 89 Immediate Past President and Secretary/Treasurer, seven (7) Governors-at-large, 90 one Osteopathic Resident Governor, or an allopathic Resident Governor in 91 osteopathic focused education at a family medicine residency with ACGME 92 osteopathic recognition status and one Osteopathic Student Governor as provided 93 for in the Bylaws. 94 95 B. The Speaker and Vice Speaker of the Congress of Delegates shall be *ex-officio* 96 members of the Board of Governors with voice but no vote. 97 98 **Section 3.** Quorum 99 A quorum of the Board of Governors will be a simple majority of the total eligible voting 100 Board members, which includes active Officers and Governors.-101 102 103 **ARTICLE VII - OFFICERS** 104 105 **Section 1.** Composition 106 The elected officers of the College shall be the President, President-Elect, the 107 Immediate Past President and Secretary/Treasurer. 108 109 **Section 5.** Duties of Officers 110 C.. 111 112 E. **Immediate Past President:** 113 The Immediate Past President shall perform duties and provide advice and 114 counsel as requested by the President. 115 F. Vacancies: 116 117 118 (1) In the event the office of President becomes vacant, the President-Elect assumes 119 the office of the President. The office of President-Elect shall then be declared 120 vacant, and said position shall be assumed by the Secretary/Treasurer. The 121 President shall appoint an individual to assume the office of 122 Secretary/Treasurer as provided in the Bylaws. 123 124 (2) In the event the President becomes disabled and unable to perform the duties of 125 the office, but does not request the President-Elect to assume the duties of the 126 President, it shall be the prerogative of the Board of Governors to declare the 127 President disabled and request the President-Elect to assume the duties of the 128 President. Such action can only be taken by a two-thirds vote of quorum of 129 Board members present and voting. 130
