SUBJECT: Proposed amendments to the ACOFP Bylaws regarding the ACOFP Committees SUBMITTED BY: **ACOFP Board of Governors** REFERRED TO: 2022 American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) Congress of Delegates **RESOLUTION NO. 26** WHEREAS, the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) Board of Governors drafted and approved the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan in October 2019 and Congress was first able to approve it in March 2021; and WHEREAS, one key objective raised by the Board during strategic planning in June 2019 was to work on enhancing ACOFP's organizational effectiveness by assessing and streamlining our governance structure; and WHEREAS, the Board's goal is to ensure ACOFP is being governed in a way that is responsive to today's fast-changing society and profession, ensuring a more representative, effective and efficient board and committee structure, which will naturally make ACOFP a more nimble and successful organization; and WHEREAS, to support this goal and given the pandemic, strategic planning and Board feedback, the Board voted to appoint a Governance Task Force to explore leading practices in governance of healthcare organizations and charged the Task Force to: Align ACOFP's board composition and committee structures to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of governance in order to advance the profession and sustain the organization. The aspirational organizational objectives include: · Being efficient, effective and inclusive • Advancing organizational performance • Ensuring all appointments are based on objective competencies and multi-faceted diversity elements that are needed to represent the membership and profession • Creating processes that are perceived as open, fair and consistent • Increasing leadership opportunities; and WHEREAS, the ACOFP Board of Governors sought council from the Association Management Center (AMC) dating back to February 2020 to review ACOFP's current governance, benchmark ACOFP against association leading practices, and provide governance training to the Board; and WHEREAS, AMC conducted leadership interviews and sent out a survey in April 2020 to

committee members, ACOFP Future Leaders alum and past presidents asking feedback

to help evaluate factors that impact the effectiveness of the ACOFP's governance

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structure; and

35 36 37	whereas, the April 2020 Governance and March 2021 Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) surveys illustrate member confusion on ACOFP's leadership pathways and opportunities as currently organized; and
38 39 40	WHEREAS, the Board of Governors focused their generative discussions at the June 2020 and 2021 strategic planning meetings around ways to further enhance ACOFP's governance; and
41 42 43 44 45	WHEREAS, current bylaws have a nine year term limit per committee with no term-limit for the chair position allowing for a member to serve as chair for their entire time on a committee, which decreases volunteer engagement and the opportunity for ACOFP members to expand their leadership skills in the role as chair; and
46 47 48 49 50	WHEREAS, current bylaws do not have a limit on the number of committees or chair roles any one member can support and having any one member serve on several committees simultaneously, particularly if in the position as chair, reduces the availability of these leadership opportunities for other members; and
51 52 53 54	WHEREAS, the proposed resolution helps with succession planning and works to ensure one- person doesn't have all the information needed for a program to be a success; now, therefore be it
55 56 57	RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) amend Article X, Section 5 of the Bylaws as follows:
58 59 60 61	(old material crossed out, new material added in color) Article X Section 5
62 63 64 65 66 67 68	Standing committee members and chairs—shall serve a maximum of up to three—six (63) consecutive threeone-year terms. Years served as committee chair do not count against the years serving as a committee member. A member is eligible to serve on that same committee after two years have passed from their time of service on that committee. , with the exception that the member may complete the term in which nine (9) years or more of service is completed.
69 70 71	Members may only serve on a maximum of 2 committees at a time, not including service on an ACOFP work group or task force.
72 73 74 75 76	Committee chairs may serve a one-year term, renewable two times (3 years total). A member may only serve as chair of one ACOFP committee at a time, but may still serve on a second committee, plus additional ACOFP work groups and/or task forces. In situations where no committee members apply to be chair, the President has the authority to extend the term of the current chair until a replacement is found.
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
